## Zone" Module 11, Adventure 1

#### **Prompt:**

Using materials around your home, plan and build your own mini-city!

#### Materials:

- Assorted recycled materials and/or LEGO/blocks/toys around your home
- Tape and/or glue
- Pencil
- Optional: A large sheet of cardboard or poster board to construct your city on
- Optional: Assorted craft supplies, such as construction paper, markers, crayons, pipe cleaners, straws, toothpicks, index cards, craft sticks, etc.
- Optional: Explorer Notebook or a piece of paper

#### Instructions:

- 1. First, think about what is in a city:
  - a. What are important buildings that every city needs? Fire station, school, grocery store, etc.
  - b. Does the city have a "center" or a "square"?
  - c. Where do the people in your city live?
  - d. Are there roads?
  - e. What is your city called?
- 2. Using your Explorer Notebook or a piece of paper and a pencil, create a sketch of your city.
- 3. Construct your city. Consider using these materials:
  - a. Recycled materials like cardboard, tissue boxes, egg cartons, etc.
  - b. Any building toys, LEGO, blocks, etc.

c. Assorted craft supplies, such as toothpicks, craft sticks, straws, index cards, etc.

For explorers using an Explorer Notebook:

- 1. Before you build your city, sketch your plan in your Explorer Notebook.
- 2. Write some interesting facts about your city.

Check out the last page for a page design idea. You can use this or set up your page however you want!

#### **Extensions:**

The following are optional steps you can take if you want to extend this adventure:

- 1. Give someone at home a tour of your city.
- 2. You are the mayor of your city. What rules or laws would you want to have in your city?
- 3. Go to the "In the Construction Zone" topic on Flipgrid and share your city!
